Webbs in History:

Muhammad Alexander Russell Webb

Alexander Russell Webb was born November 9, 1846 in Hudson, Columbia County, New York. He was the son of Alexander Nelson and Caroline Webb. Alexander, the father, was listed as a "Printer" in the 1860 census and "Editor of the Daily Star," on the 1870 census. Alexander Russell was the second oldest of 6 children. While his eldest brother studied medicine, Alexander went to Claverack College, an institution that closed its doors in 1902. Like his father, Alexander had his sights set on journalism. He moved to Missouri and became the publisher and editor of the Unionville Republic newspaper in Unionville. During his career, he worked at several other Missouri papers and ended up as assistant editor at the Missouri Republican in St. Louis. He was an active Democrat and a

well-known St. Louis journalist, and caught the attention of President Grover Cleveland who appointed him to the post of Consular Representative to the Philippines in Manila.

Alexander was raised a Presbyterian, but at some point gave up on religion altogether. This period of renouncing religion lasted approximately 15 years. But in the year 1881, he began to explore other religions, and in 1888 he declared himself a Muslim, giving him the distinction of being the first Anglo-American convert to Islam.

By this time, Muhammad Alexander Russell Webb had married his wife Ella, and she and their three children had also converted. In 1892 he resigned his post in Manila and began to tour India giving lectures on Islamic philosophy, while his family settled briefly in San Francisco. Upon his return to America, he and his family went back to New York where he established the Oriental Publishing Co. His company published many of his writings and books, including his book called "Islam in America."

Muhammad Alexander R. Webb was the leading representative for Islam at the 1893 World Parliament of Religions in Chicago and continued for the rest of his life to be the main spokesperson for Islam in America. He continued to lecture, and one source says that many of the most noted thinkers of the time attended his lectures, including Mark Twain.

He eventually settled in Rutherford, New Jersey and lived there until his death. He died on October 1, 1916 and was buried at Hillside Cemetery outside of Rutherford. He was just shy of his 70th birthday when he died. The 1900 Bergen County, New Jersey census lists Alexander R. Webb as a journalist living with his wife Ella G. and their three children: Mary C., Russell L. and Nala D. Mary and Russell, were born in Missouri, and Nala was born in the Philippines. In 1910, Alexander gave his profession as a clerk in a mercantile.

According to the census, Muhammad Alexander Russell Webb's only son, Russell, had two daughters, but did not have any sons to continue his Webb line.

Godfrey Armitage, of Lynn, 1630. Immigrant; a tailor. His brother Joseph, in 1661, made affidavit that he and Godfrey had eighty acres assigned to them in the division of Lynn lands.

Freeman, 14 March, 1638-9.

In 1643, September, he signed petition of Jane, wife of brother Joseph, for a continuance to her of the license to "keep and ordinary;" the petition with his fac-simile autograph may be found in the N. W. H. G. Reg., 1879. Godfrey removed to Boston, and, about 1644, married **Sarah**, daughter of **William and Rebekah Webb**; two children.

...About December 1654, **Rebekah Webb** died, leaving all her property to her grand-child, Rebekah Armitage, Godfrey's daughter; will mentions Godfrey, and he appears on the records as overseer.

William Webb, of Roxbury. Immigrant. Freeman, 25 May, 1636. On Rev. John Eliot's record of members of Roxbury Church. On early Roxbury records, list of persons and estates: **William Webb**, nineteen acres, four persons, estate L2. Wife, Rebekah; parentage unknown.

In 1640, son **Joseph** born, 19, August

In 1643, "8 mo., **goodwife Web**" disciplined by Roxbury Church

Rebekah was restored to communion, recommended to Boston Church and admitted there with her husband, 7 April, 1644.

In December of same year, **William Webb** was buried.

In April, 1653, **Rebekah** sold her Roxbury estate.

In 1654, December 10, she made her will, leaving her grandchild, Rebekah Armitage, sole heir of her estate; mentioning "her father Godfrey Armitage," and in another place, "sonne Armitage," and again, "sonne in lawe." Estate inventoried 22 December, 1654; will proved 23 February, 1654-5; Armitage, one of the overseers. They deposed 16 March, 1654, and gave bond for L180; Armitage here made his mark.

History of Mercer Co., PA, 1888

“...On leaving college Epaphroditus [Cossitt], settled in Warren, Ohio, in 1805, and commenced the practice of medicine. He at once obtained a reputation as a surgeon. His first operation was the amputation of the thigh of Hon. Webb, a prominent attorney at law...”

“Cottage Methodist Episcopal Church was organized before 1856, by Rev. Dillon Pearson, in what was known as Cape-Horn School-house. The original members were George Jones and wife. John Webb and wife, Mrs. Doratha Peter, Mary Black, Rev. Robert Boyd and John Dight and wife...”

“Daniel Nelson, retired farmer, was born October 1, 1815, in Huntingdon County, Penn., to John and Margaret [Graff] Nelson, natives of the same county. The former was of Irish extraction and the latter of German. The parents came to Mercer County in the spring of 1837, and settled in what is now Springfield Township. Here they bought land, on which they died. Daniel attended the country schools of his boyhood days. At the age of twenty-three years he married to Mary, a daughter of George Webb, and early settler of his county. He took his bride to a farm of 140 acres given him by his father...”

“Dr. Fayette Herrick, dentist, was born in Ontario County, N. Y., August 6, 1834, and is a son of Eben A. and Malinda [Webb] Herrick, natives of New York State. When our subject was quite young his parents removed to Michigan, where his father died. His mother afterward returned to New York when she removed to Trumbull County, Ohio, where she now lives.”

“Samuel M. Webb, farmer, post-office Mercer, was born March 16, 1863, on the farm where he now resides. His father, James Webb, was born on the farm now owned and occupied by B. A. William, in East Lackawannock Township. He was a brother of Mrs. Daniel Nelson, of Mercer. He married Belle McKay, who died in 1864, leaving one child, Samuel M. After the death of his mother our subject live with his aunt, Eliza McLain, of Mercer, until five years old, and until eight with his father, when he was sent to Pittsburgh, where he attended school for four years, making his home with aunts, Jane and Amelia, sisters of his father. He then joined his father on the farm, they doing their own housework, until November 24, 1884, when the father died, and our subject was married December 25, the same year, to Mary Hunter, daughter of Alexander and Elizabeth [Alexander] Hunter. Her mother died when she was six months old, leaving four children: Ida, George, Mina and Mary. Her father was again married, to Elizabeth McMillan, and had four children: Mattie, Louis, Bertha and Clara. Mr. and Mrs. Samuel M. Webb have two children: Nannie and Elva. Mr. Webb is a Republican, a good farmer, and buys and sells stock.

“Application was made in 1704 to the Chichester and Concord Monthly Meeting of Friends, by John Bennet and Elizabeth Webb, “on behalf of the inhabitants of the upper part of Birmingham and Brandywine Creek,” to have a meeting at the house of John Bennett. This application was granted and afterwards confirmed by the Quarterly Meeting. Birmingham meeting had its origin in the meeting thus established.”

“...The following extract from a letter from Elizabeth Webb, a very intelligent public Friend of Birmingham, while on a religious visit to Long Island, Rhode Island, &c. furnishes this information. The letter is dated at “Newport on Road Island ye 24th of ye 6th mo. 1724,” and is addressed to Joseph Brinton of Thornbury. After treating of religious and social affairs, she speaks of having made arrangements for the purchase of a horse, and advises her friend how to proceed in case “he hath a mind for one.” “Our paper money.” She says, “will not do, and if thou get some changed, it should be for whole pieces of gold for that which is cut will not pass but at L6 an ounce, but the Pistole goes for L1, 8s. Od. And a Moidore at L2. 4s. and a half Pistole for 14s.”
